We look forward to welcoming your son or daughter to the school for them to become one of our successes of the future.



We aim for our students to embody our motto 'Success is an Attitude' through setting the highest standards and aspirations for everyone.

Learning at The Chalfonts Community College is exciting, interactive and prepares students for their future. Students are taught to value learning and think for themselves. We do this by providing them with opportunities to better themselves and not be afraid to make mistakes.

FEELING VALUED

The happiness of our students is very important to us. Exceptional pastoral care systems are in place to help our students flourish.

The atmosphere at The Chalfonts Community College is welcoming as we want our students to feel valued even before they join the College. This is done as part of our comprehensive transition programme which includes numerous primary school festivals that we organise for our local feeder schools.

We understand that all students have different needs so we provide Year 7 with their own outdoor space to help them settle in. Students with special educational needs are also given the additional support they require from an exceptional team of Learning Support staff.

Every student belongs to a tutor group. The job of the tutors is to look after the welfare of each student in their group. If students feel overwhelmed or need a listening ear, there is always someone to talk to. We offer pastoral support in various forms such as: quiet rooms, a sixth-form buddy, medical welfare, one-toone counselling, as well as lunchtime support clubs run by students and the pastoral support team.


Students enjoy being at the school and behaviour is good. Should issues arise, we use our clear Behaviour for Learning policy which is underpinned by the principle of respect for all. Throughout the academic year, parents have access to their child's attendance, behaviour and progress via the Arbor App and we also keep parents updated with termly progress reports and annual Parents' Evenings.

We believe that it is important to recognise and celebrate successes. Therefore, each term, rewards are offered to students for: effort, attainment, attendance as well as our four values: *commitment, courtesy, conscientiousness and community-minded*. Some of these rewards include: days out and tea with the principal.

NURTURING TALENT

We believe that every child has unique talents, gifts and needs and so we offer a wide range of clubs and activities to develop our students' interests and skills.

Academic study is important and we expect all students to achieve, but education at The Chalfonts Community College is also about embracing the creative, physical and spiritual as much as the intellectual.

Whether it is football, netball, singing or you just want to catch up with your homework, we offer clubs and activities to suit everyone. We want all students to try new things so that we can help nurture them and discover hidden talent. We encourage everyone to actively participate in joining a club and take part in inter-form, county and national competitions.

There are countless opportunities for students to showcase their talents each year. Some of these include school productions, concerts and sports days. In addition, specialist music teachers offer private tuition on-site in a variety of instruments for which bursaries up to 100% are available for students who may otherwise struggle to meet costs.

Each year, sporting achievements are formally recognised at the annual Sports Awards and prize giving ceremony.

THE LEARNING ENVIRONMENT

We are fortunate enough to have a wide range of well-equipped facilities which make up our spacious and attractive learning environment.

We aim to cater for all our students' needs as much as possible to provide them with skills they need when they venture outside the school gates.

Children have a tremendous capacity to be creative and it is our responsibility to give them a challenging and supportive environment which enables them to achieve their goals.



The school has spacious grounds and buildings, so we can accommodate all students comfortably. We have two large cafeterias and a 'grab n' go' service; all of which serve healthy and tasty, hot and cold foods.


There are lifts throughout the school, Evac-Chairs and a purpose-built wet-room. In addition, we have a successful Learning Support department so that children with additional needs and an Educational Health Care Plan (EHCP) are very well looked after.

The Sixth Form prepares students for the next stage of their lives and support is offered to students at every step of the way to ease the transition from GCSE.

Our Sixth Form is an extremely friendly place to be. We are immensely proud of our students and all of their achievements. We have high expectations of our students and we never settle for anything less than their personal best.


Sixth Formers are trusted to enjoy privileges and freedoms not available to the younger students such as independent study periods during the day and a common room. In return, we expect Sixth Formers to be responsible role models for students in the lower school.

As in the lower school, Sixth Formers are placed in a tutor group. Sixth Form tutors look after student welfare, monitor academic progress and guide students through university and apprenticeship applications.

Each year many students go on to university, higher apprenticeships and drama or music colleges. Student destinations include: Bath, Exeter, Southampton, Leeds, Manchester, UCL and Imperial College.
