

The Chalfonts Sixth Form HOME/SCHOOL AGREEMENT

As a member of the Chalfonts Sixth Form College I agree to:

- Abide by all of The College's policies (i.e. no food to be brought out of the cafés; no ball games to be played during lesson time on College premises; no smoking on or near The College)
- Treat all members of The College with respect and courtesy
- Be a good role model for younger students
- Ensure parents/guardians telephone or email the Sixth Form Office (Mrs Darvill) by 9.10am if I am ill or unable to attend College for any other reason
- Attend <u>all</u> registration periods with my tutor
- Attend all lessons (a minimum of 96% attendance is expected)
- Be punctual
- Bring appropriate equipment to lessons
- Adhere to the dress code (see separate dress code policy)
- Meet deadlines
- Respect The College environment and treat it accordingly
- Sign (or fob) in/out when entering or leaving The College
- Use independent study periods appropriately
- Make the most of all opportunities available to me as part of The Chalfonts Sixth Form



The Chalfonts Sixth Form PRIVILEGES

Sixth Form students at The College are given independence in a range of ways:

- Independent study periods are included on the timetable in order to help you manage your workload effectively. This provides you with time during the day to seek support and guidance from staff, as well as making use of all learning resources at The College.
- You may use the Independent Study Centre and the Learning Resource Centre for private study at any time during the day if space is available. We maintain a quiet "library" noise level in the Study Centre.
- The Personal Development Programme has been created to enable you to broaden your experience, skills and talents while in the Sixth Form.
- Cars may be brought to college, and a specific car park has been made available for you in the Leisure Centre. Spaces are available daily on a first come first served basis and cars are parked at the owner's risk. You will need to give your car registration details to Mrs Darvill in the Sixth Form Office to be granted this privilege.
- The cafés are open throughout the day for Sixth Formers, helping to ensure that queuing during break and lunchtimes is avoided. Please vacate the cafés at break and lunchtimes to make room for KS3 and KS4 students. The cafés also provide another place for you to work and socialise. The café staff may ask you to vacate these areas for various reasons at certain times.
- The one way system has to be followed during lesson change over only.
- Mobile telephones may be used in a discreet manner in the Chikara foyers <u>only</u> and must be turned to silent in the Study Centre.
- Music players (with headphones) may be used discreetly during private study times and in lessons where teachers deem it appropriate.
- After passing the health check you may enter/leave the school premises during school hours via a side gate near the sixth form centre, by paying a £10 refundable deposit to Rachel Mackeith who will issue you with a security fob. It is important that you each tap in/out individually and do not let others in at the same time so that we can maintain attendance records for fire/safety purposes. If you enter/leave the site without a fob you MUST sign in/out at either Chikara or reception. The College reserves the right to revoke a student's privilege to hold a security fob for any reason and at any time.

NB: Please remember that with these additional 'Rights' comes the expectation that you will show increasing levels of 'Responsibility' as a young adult at The College.
