You are not alone! There's always someone to speak to. Bullying is not ok. This week and always we are **#UnitedAgainstBullying**.



Year 8 are currently studying Lewis Carroll's novel **'Alice in Wonderland'**. The classic has inspired them to get creative. Here are some incredible creations... Well done **Zoe Ash** for making this fabulous **'Alice'**.



Producing 'Elephant toothpaste' in Science



Early into the Autumn term, our new Year 7s conducted an amazingly 'cool' demonstration experiment in Science. The purpose was to give them an example of the types of experiments they might be involved in over the next few years.

The ingredients used were food colouring, yeast, hydrogen peroxide, washing up liquid and warm water. The outcome was Elephant toothpaste!

What did we learn from this experiment? The yeast contains an enzyme called Catalase that breaks down hydrogen peroxide into oxygen gas and water. The oxygen gas gets trapped by the soap, and you get a large foamy solution that squirts out of the top of the bottle resembling toothpaste. This was a much larger version hence the **'Elephant Toothpaste'** nickname!

Year 7 student delivers an assembly for 'World Diabetes Day'

On **'World Diabetes Day'** this year, **Henry Hawley**, one of our Year 7 students, delivered an amazing whole school assembly, entitled **'Living with Diabetes'** via **Zoom**. Henry was diagnosed with the condition two years ago and talked about how he manages it on a day to day basis. He has to be constantly aware of his insulin levels; if they go low, he has to increase his sugar and carbohydrate intake, and if they go high he has to use his insulin pump.



Henry wanted to raise the awareness of this condition across the school and also of the **JDRF Charity (Juvenile Diabetes Research Foundation)** which works to improve access to treatments and technologies for people with Type 1 Diabetes. He has

raised **£345** for this charity so far. Henry also wanted to share information so that his friends have a better understanding of the condition and he wanted to reassure them that the symptoms are controlled using his pump. He has managed to overcome his fear of injections and is referred to by the hospital as **'Bionic Boy.'**

"Running the assembly was a nerve-racking experience but I really wanted to do it and I am so pleased that I have managed to get the messages across. I am grateful for all the lovely comments I have had."



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Bringing the world of work to the Curriculum

Under 'normal' circumstances the **Bucks Skills Hub** would have held the annual **Bucks Skills Show** in October. The Show is an interactive careers experience where young people can discover different industry sectors and ask questions about career pathways – unfortunately, this event could not take place in its planned form. Instead, it was brought to the classroom virtually and titled **"Bringing Lessons to Life"** with an emphasis on linking careers to the curriculum.

Our teachers were given a timetable of events relating to their subject areas and asked to register to take part. The sessions were delivered live by employers with the opportunity for our students to ask questions at the end. Sessions included: Maths: Ratio & Proportion, *Galiford Try*, Science: Biology, Biodiversity, *Align*, Design Technology: Using CAD & CAM, *KW Special Projects*, English: Writing and Researching for News, *Bucks New University – Multi Media Journalism*, History: Battle of Britain and Aerial Bombardment, *Historical England...* and many more.

Students who participated found the sessions interesting and informative. They enjoyed relating the topics they were studying in class directly with careers and the world of work.

Introducing Unifrog



Our school is currently working to achieve and maintain the eight career related Gatsby benchmarks. The Gatsby benchmarks were identified

following a report commissioned to improve career guidance in England. These benchmarks have now been adopted as part of the Government's careers strategy for schools and colleges.

In order to assist our school, embed the benchmarks and continue to strive for excellent initiatives to inspire, aspire and motivate our students, the school has introduced **Unifrog**, a destinations platform – a 'one-stop-shop' for students across KS3, KS4 and KS5 regardless of their interests or academic ability. Students can compare every university course, apprenticeship and Further Education course in the United Kingdom. It also provides labour market information and advice on careers and subjects for all routes.

Unifrog will help students to record and evidence their key career related activities and competencies (employability skills), and prepare their CVs and personal statements.

Unifrog will assist our students' progression at key stages and help them make informed, impartial decisions at 16+ and 18+.

Unifrog has been introduced to Years 11, 12 & 13. Year 8 will receive information about using the platform in the New Year when they are introduced to the GCSE option process. Years 7, 9 & 10 will also receive news about using the tool early in the Spring term. **Unifrog** are currently working on compiling a central location for sourcing virtual work experience placements, this will be invaluable for our students, particularly those in Year 10.

Parents/Guardians, you will be sent notification when your child is introduced to **Unifrog**. You will receive a parent login which will enable you to use the platform as if you were a student, allowing you to support your child in their exploration and possible future decisions.



Promoting a love of problem solving

In November, students in Years 11-13 competed in the **UKMT Senior Maths Challenge**.



The Maths Challenge is a national competition that encourages mathematical reasoning, precision of thought and fluency in using basic mathematical techniques to solve interesting problems. Although it is a multiple-choice test, it is very, very tough!

Over 90,000 pupils from across the UK competed in the challenge and this year we had **one gold, two silver** and **three bronze**. **Alex King** in Year 13 (2nd from right) also managed to qualify for the follow-up round called the **Senior Kangaroo** and narrowly missed out on the **Olympiad**. **Erin Bacon** in Year 11 got a **bronze** which is a fantastic feat given the challenge is predominantly sat by the best mathematicians in Year 12 and Year 13.

Christmas arrives at CCC!



Sixth Form students delivering 'World of Work' programme to Year 7s

Many **congratulations** to members of our Sixth Form Leadership Team who have delivered a very successful two part 'World of Work' programme to our Year 7 students at tutor time over the last four weeks. The team consisted of our **Head Boy** and **Head Girl**, **Dan McEvoy** and **Beth Bowers** who, along with **Holly Butler**, are also our **Student Career Leaders**; and the **Deputies**; **Shaila Rajput**, **Loveday Grant**, **Mitchell Cumber** and **Louis Cooke**.

Part one was an introduction to the words 'careers' and 'employability' and involved an activity about the importance of **qualifications, skills, work experience** and a **positive attitude** to achieve career goals in life. The students then spent some time considering lots of different job roles relating to props pulled out of a bag.

For part two of the programme, the students worked in groups with a member of the Sixth Form team to consider the many jobs associated with different places – a hospital, football stadium, hotel, airport, theatre. They filled flipchart sheets of jobs and a discussion followed about the number of roles you can do that cross different areas. We then talked about the

questions students need to start asking themselves about the direction they might like to take in the future.

Each student has been asked to complete a 'Career trump card' over the Christmas period and the Sixth Form team will be reviewing all of these in the New Year.

"I believe this programme will inspire Year 7's to be enthusiastic about careers and, if they have one to aspire to, will possibly be even more motivated in classes. I think they will be able to grasp the key qualities needed for employability and hopefully understand hard work pays off. I love delivering this assembly and seeing their facial expressions when we ask them what they want to do as a job. Seeing them so enthusiastic about it is brilliant.
