







The Cruel Prince By Holly Black

Genre: Fantasy (a bit of romance) Release date: 2nd January 2018 General time to read: 2-4weeks Chapter length average: 8/9pages Pages in book: 400 pages

Blurb:

Of course I want to be like them. They're beautiful as blades forged in some divine fire. They will live forever. And Cardan is even more beautiful than the rest. I hate him more than all the others. I hate him so much that sometimes when I look at him, I can hardly breathe.



Jude was seven when her parents were murdered and she and her two sisters were stolen away to live in the treacherous High Court of Faerie. Ten years later, Jude wants nothing more than to belong there, despite her mortality. But many of the fey despise humans. Especially Prince Cardan, the youngest and wickedest son of the High King.

To win a place at the Court, she must defy him – and face the consequences. As Jude becomes more deeply embroiled in palace intrigues and deceptions, she discovers her own capacity for trickery and bloodshed. But as betrayal threatens to drown the Courts of Faerie in violence, Jude will need to risk her life in a dangerous alliance to save her sisters, and Faerie itself.




I thought the book was very good and it's just a nice book that takes you on a relaxing journey but can sometimes be quite heartbreaking and scary.








Art Exhibition

The sunflower has been Ukraine's national flower since 1700, but it has swiftly become a worldwide symbol of solidarity for the country and its people since the Russian invasion began.

Magic Maths!

Promoting a love of problem solving

In February, students in Years 9 - 11 competed in the 2022 UKMT Intermediate Maths Challenge.

The Maths Challenge is a national competition that encourages mathematical reasoning, precision of thought and fluency in using basic mathematical techniques to solve interesting problems. Although it is a multiple-choice test, it is very, very tough!

Over 200,000 of the most able maths students from more than 3000 schools and colleges across the UK participated in the IMC. Only the highest scorers are awarded certificates and this this year we had two students that secured Gold.

Pupils at Chalfonts Community achieved 2 Gold, 3 Silver and 16 Bronze certificates in this year's challenge which is fantastic. Furthermore, due to their extraordinary performance, Srija (Y11, Gold) and Kyros (Y9, Gold) were invited to take part in the follow up round called the Pink and Grey kangaroo and they both qualified in that too, which is a Chalfont's first so well done to both of them.
