We know that positive behaviour and positive attitudes to learning create an environment for all students to succeed and as such have defined these behaviours and attitudes in our values.




Our values are that we are Committed, Conscientious, Courteous and Community Minded.

These values were created through consultation with students last term and have been launched with students in assembly this week. We place a very high value on these behaviours and reward students in line with these values. I am delighted there have been over 750 merit points awarded to students. The majority of these merits have been awarded to students who have already shown the school values of commitment and conscientiousness in their learning.









Every Lesson Every Day

Our values are an important part of our expectations for every lesson, every day.

We aim for the highest standards of teaching and learning and want all students to have the opportunity to succeed. We have incorporated the best features of highly effective teaching and learning into our lessons.

Many of the features of our *Every Lesson Every Day* structure are based upon cognitive science research along with the outcome of our work with the Department for Education's Behaviour Hub programme to create a positive climate for learning.

Behaviour for learning

Our expectations of students' behaviour and attitudes to learning are high and in line with our values. Students are expected to follow the principles for success in Every Lesson Every Day, which are shown here. We are confident in this structure being right for students to enable them to make good progress with their learning and be a part of a well-ordered school community.

Part of the commitment students' show to the school is wearing uniform with pride. If uniform is not correct students will have a detention in the morning break with a senior member of staff. Attendance

Attendance at school is very important so that students can attend Every Lesson Every Day. As a parent/carer you want the best for your child. Having a good education is an important factor in opening up opportunities in adult life.

There is a lot of educational research that shows a clear link between educational outcomes and attendance to school. We know that when attendance drops below 97% we start to see negative impacts on learning. An attendance of 90% means a student misses 19 days of education, which equates to 95 lessons over an academic year. An attendance of 80% equals 38 missed days and 190 lessons.

You can help your child to ensure they don't miss school days by helping them to understand the importance of good attendance; taking an interest in their school work; encouraging them to get involved in school activities; discuss any problems they may have at school and arrange appointments and outings after school hours, at weekends or during school holidays.

Parents are reminded that all term time absences (except for sickness) must be requested in writing to me in advance. Please do not book holidays in term time, as this will not be authorised. Sickness absences should be reported by email attendance@chalfonts.org or telephoning 01753 882032 Option 2. Please include your child's full name, tutor group and the reason for the absence.

Parking and Buses

We understand that many parents pick up and drop off students in the morning and afternoon. In the morning, the arrival of buses makes the turning circle very busy and I encourage you to park safely when driving and be considerate of our neighbours when bringing your children to and from school. The Tunmers estate, next to the school, is private. Please do not use this road to wait for your child or to turn around.

Thank you for your patience in this first week with some problems we experienced with school buses. We are in contact with the bus companies to ensure home school transport runs smoothly.
