COVID vaccinations for children and young people aged 12 -15

As you may be aware, NHS England and the Joint Committee on Immunisations and Vaccinations (JCVI) updated their guidance on 29th November 2021 recommended that all children and young people aged 12-15 years should be offered a 2nd dose of Pfizer/BioNTech COVID-19 vaccine at a minimum of 12 weeks from the first dose. As such, the Bucks School-Aged Immunisation Team (SAI) will offer this second phase of the COVID-19 vaccination programme for children aged 12-15 years on Thursday 3rd February. Children who have not yet had their first dose of COVID-19 can also receive this during the COVID-19 session.
